Tracy Rice



Canadian singer/songwriter Tracy Rice hit the international stage in 2003 when she opened for country music's Terri Clark and then won a Nashville Song Search songwriting award for her single, "Won't Leave You Behind." Subsequently, she took the plunge and moved to the US where she is fast becoming known for her powerful alto, no-holds-barred

lyrics, and passionate stage presence. Her style has been described in various combinations of rock, pop, folk, country, americana, acoustic, and adult contemporary. While fans tend to see the singer/songwriter as a rocker, reviewers note her ability to walk the line between rock and New Country, evoking characterizations of the love child of Melissa Etheridge and Terri Clark. The daughter of Scottish and Barbadian parents, Rice appreciates the overlap between genres and jokingly claims to be only as country as her childhood idols, the Eagles. Onstage, she is a consummate entertainer, delighting first-time audiences with a blend of Canadian good humor, husky vocals, and some rock snarl.

Tungsten Coil



The Music of Tungsten Coil is a mix of modern electronic/industrial music combined with the more dynamic and emotional sounds of a traditional driving rock band. Melded together

to create an eclectic sound that feeds the listeners craving for something different. Tungsten Coil also brings back what has been missing from the live performances of today's music; A spectacular "Rock Show" - lights, fog, visuals and all the things that make a live performance memorable. The five members of Tungsten Coil are as hard working as the element itself, applying their energy towards their attention to detail among the music, the show, and promotions. Tungsten Coil's diverse, yet addictive, music, along with their intense and high energy stage shows, have contributed to their immediate success. The fast-building buzz in Austin helped land them their first SXSW showcase only 5 months after their first show. The band also took 4th place as "Best Industrial Band" in the recent 2007 Austin Music Awards, with votes due only 3 months after their debut.
